To use role play to take on the roles of shoppers and shopkeepers</p>	<p>Pleased to Meet You To apply previous skills and knowledge of topic areas such as spellings and jobs. To learn to express emotions. To talk about the future, using two different tenses.</p> <p>All About Ourselves To apply previous knowledge of topic areas such as clothes and the body, developing their vocabulary at the same time. To learn to describe their own appearance using some key grammatical features of French, such as the position and agreement of adjectives.</p> <p>That's Tasty! To learn key vocabulary related to food and drink. To learn specific vocabulary of how to say what drinks they like, what they like to eat for breakfast, fillings for sandwiches, toppings for pizzas, what snacks they like and also the opening and closing times of shops.</p>	<p>Location and You! To learn relevant vocabulary and phrases to be able to find the way around a French town. To talk about the places in town and give directions in French.</p> <p>Where is this? To learn key vocabulary related to France and, in particular, Paris. To learn specific vocabulary to describe France's neighbours and positions/distances of a variety of cities. To learn the French names for famous French landmarks and how to describe what people do when they visit Paris.</p> <p>Let's Go Shopping To develop French communication skills by being immersed in a French shopping experience.</p>

<p>Time To learn the days of the week, months and dates To count on from 11 to 31</p> <p>Family and Friends To identify and introduce family and pets. To spell names using the French alphabet. To learn the names for places in the home.</p> <p>Our School To learn key vocabulary and phrases on the theme of school. To learn vocabulary for places around school and classroom objects. To take part in a PE-themed lesson conducted mostly in French. To combine learning to express preferences about activities and school subjects.</p>	<p>Time To learn how to tell the time at: o'clock, half past, quarter past and quarter to. To learn how to read timetables and TV schedules and answer simple questions about these. To use knowledge of French vocabulary to calculate the difference between two times.</p> <p>Where in the World? To learn key vocabulary related to countries/ continents and animals. To learn specific vocabulary of countries of the United Kingdom, continents and animals from different continents and a country's position related to the equator. To learn key phrases connected to geography.</p> <p>Holidays and Hobbies To learn key vocabulary related to holidays, weather and seasons, sports and hobbies. To learn specific vocabulary of how to say what the weather is like, temperatures, names of different sports and hobbies. To learn key phrases connected to the holidays and hobbies.</p>	<p>Time To apply previous skills and knowledge of topic areas such as numbers and dates, extending this to talk about key events in French history. To begin to learn one of the common past tenses in the French language. To learn to give dates of birth/death for famous French people.</p> <p>Family and Friends To apply previous skills and knowledge of topic areas such as animals, homes and family to extend their conversation abilities. To expand their vocabulary and consolidate their understanding of descriptive language, including subjective descriptions.</p> <p>School Life To use key vocabulary related to objects, subjects and prepositional language. To use French vocabulary to participate in a Maths lesson on the names of 2D shapes. To learn questions and answers useful at school. To learn key phrases connected to the school life.</p>	<p>Time To tell the time: o'clock, half past, quarter past, quarter to and 5 minute intervals. To learn how to use 24 hour times and the way in which the French represent a.m. and p.m. To use airport arrival and departure boards and a school timetable to consolidate and practise the skills learned.</p> <p>Our World To describe key environmental challenges in the local area, developing awareness of sustainability at the same time. To learn how to use the immediate future to say what positive environmental actions people are going to take. To prepare and deliver a short presentation, using all the phrases and vocabulary learnt in this unit.</p> <p>Ready to Move on To consolidate their French knowledge and skills focusing on key areas of language learning: phonics, vocabulary, grammar, literacy, oracy and culture. To showcase learning in French in KS2 in readiness for transition to KS3.</p>
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
